Antelope Valley Quilt Association General Meeting Minutes June 13, 2024

President-Elect Pat Crook, substituting for President Nani Craig, called the meeting to order at 6:04 pm at Lancaster United Methodist Church and via Zoom. She welcomed everyone.

1st VP/Programs/Maggie Konik introduced the speaker, former AVQA member and Cotton Patch Quilt Guild President, Darla Hall. Darla's lecture and trunk show was entitled, "My Quilting Journey."

1st VP/Programs/Maggie Konik announced a guild sew-in this Saturday, June 15, at Harshfield Terrace. The July 11th guild meeting will feature Patricia Belyea on Zoom and will be a closed meeting with an ice cream social. The July sew-in will be at Quartz Hill Library. There won't be a guild meeting in August. The Welcome Back Tea will be in September. Stephanie Shuping talked about plans to offer beginning quilt making classes on 4 Saturdays in August, from 2:00 to 5:00 at Boulders I Mobile Home Park Clubhouse on Rancho Vista. The classes are for our members and residents of Boulders.

Minutes/Pat Crook asked if there were any corrections to the May guild meeting minutes. There were none and she asked for a motion to approve the minutes as published in the June newsletter. Motion was made by Cheryl Nieman and seconded by Peggy Campbell. The motion carried.

Treasurer's Report/Lynn Aguirre and Stephanie Shuping. Lynn said June is the end of our fiscal year. They will be turning in 3 reports to the state.

2nd VP/Quilt Show/Ways & Means: Vacant. Pat asked for someone or more than one person to take this important position.

Parliamentarian/Nancy Walker encouraged members to sign up for the beginner's quilting classes.

Membership/Opportunity Quilt Tickets/Sue

Jacobsen said it's time to renew your membership. Attendance was 37 members with 3 on Zoom and 2 guests, Debbie Rifkin and Karen Stocking. Membership drawing was won by Mary Coker and Cheryl Nieman.

Challenge/Carla Wolf gave a preview of our challenge, explaining how to make a challenge quilt.

Fat Quarter Drawing/Robynn Frame: Leinaala Strickler won. She chose red, white and blue for the July fat quarter color.

Door Prizes/Nette Louton substituted for Kathy Greene. JoAnn Gonzalez won.

Opportunity Quilt Promotion. Kathy Judkins took the quilt to Pine Needles Quilt Guild in Wrightwood and encouraged members to take the opportunity quilt to guild meetings to sell tickets. The drawing for the quilt will be held at the guild meeting on September 12. Nette and Pat are taking it to Cotton Patch Quilt Guild in Bakersfield.

New Business: Pat talked about the guild donating a basket to the AV Fair in return for a sponsorship. Marilyn Hendrix suggested a basket full of sewing items. It would be an advertisement for the guild. Bring items to the next meeting. LeRae Humphrey would like to see everyone enter one item in the Fair. Go to the Fair website to enter your quilt. Entries are open until August 27. Quilts are due at the Fair on September 15, so you have a couple of weeks after entering to finish your quilt.

Announcements: The June/Changeover Board Meeting will be held at Medrano's on 10th St W in Lancaster on Tuesday, June 18th, at 5:30 pm. Darla Hall thanked us for having her as our speaker. She has a new website, Quilting with Darla. Al's Vacuum & Sewing is having a virtual quilt show. Please enter and vote for your favorite quilt.

Installation of New Officers/Maggie Konik called the current executive board and all committee chairs, outgoing and incoming, to the front and gave them key rings she had made. Then she called the incoming 2024-25 board members to the front to be installed with a ceremony called "Key Capers," and she gave them key rings with a key and a little note.

Antelope Valley Quilt Association Board Meeting Minutes June 18, 2024

President/Pat Crook called the meeting to order at 5:34 pm. Meeting was held at Medrano's Restaurant in Lancaster. Kathy Judkins acting as Secretary.

Attendance: Pat Crook, Stephanie Shuping, Sue Jacobsen, Maggie Konik, Nette Louton, Lynn Aguirre, Nancy Walker, Betty Putzka, Kathy Judkins, Leinaala Strickler, Jim Roberts, Donna Roberts, Robynn Frame

President/Pat Crook welcomed everyone and said we would be going over the budget that will be presented for approval at the next guild meeting. We would also sign in and sign out position books. Pat said our boutique income this year was \$1,197 for 3 boutiques. If we don't have a quilt show, we will need to have boutiques and/or quilt auctions.

Minutes/President Pat Crook requested a motion to approve the May 2024 board meeting minutes as published in the June newsletter. A motion was made by Sue Jacobsen and seconded by Lynn Aguirre. The motion carried.

1st VP/Maggie Konik: The July meeting will be a presentation by Patricia Belayea via Zoom and an ice cream social. It will be a "closed" meeting. There will be a sew-in on the Saturday after the meeting at Quartz Hill Library. In August, we will not be meeting at the church. Alex Byrne will give a lecture via Zoom. You may want to gather with friends to watch it. Cheryl Nieman will teach a workshop on Saturday, August 10. We will have a Welcome Back Tea in September. Every friendship circle will be asked to do one basket with a sewing theme. The baskets will be raffled off. Friendship circles will talk about where and how often they meet and what they do.

Treasurer/Lynn Aguirre & Stephanie

Shuping distributed the 2024-25 Budget and talked about some of the items on it. Stephanie talked about the guild possibly participating in Antelope Valley College's combined scholarship. Nette suggested giving a small scholarship to a 4H participant. Hospitality: Discussion about the increase in rent paid to the church for using the meeting hall. The tables and chairs will be set up for us. Storage is still being worked out. Nette is moving the fabric out of her garage before July 1st.

Lynn made a motion to revisit the budget in January and if we have the funds, we will allocate \$100 to go somewhere like 4H. Sue Jacobsen seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Stephanie made a motion that we review the parameters of the contract for the church and authorize Lynn to sign the contract and make one check for the year's rent of \$1,700. Sue Jacobsen seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Parliamentarian/Nancy Walker asked if everyone turned in their notebook.

Membership/Sue Jacobsen asked what our policy is regarding charging members. She doesn't charge when we don't have a paid speaker and was checking to see if this is correct. LeRae Humphrey and JoAnne

Gonzales are the new Membership co-chairs and have already started doing Membership committee tasks.

Old Business: Nette said if we're going to do boutiques, we need to plan ahead for maybe three a year ... one in the fall for school, one for the holiday season, and one in the spring for the spring and summer holidays. There was discussion about needing to talk about friendship circles at every meeting.

New Business: Bring things to donate for the Fairgrounds basket to the July meeting, e.g., gift cards, sewing items, quilting items.

Meeting adjourned at 7:23 pm. Draft submitted for approval by Kathy Judkins.
